Make plans to celebrate Independence Day in Wentzville! The annual Fourth of July Parade starts at 10 a.m. on Tuesday, July 4 at the Wentzville Ice Arena and travels south on Luetkenhaus Boulevard turns right onto Pearce Boulevard and ends near Pearce Boulevard and Allen Street.

Residents ONLY, can join us for a FREE swim on July 4 from noon-5 p.m. at Progress Park Pool! Splash Station Aquatic Center will maintain normal daily operations for everyone with a daily admission fee.

The Wentzville fireworks show begins this year at 9:30 p.m. (please note, the time has changed slightly from previous years). Fireworks are discharged off of Wentzville Parkway near Progress Park. Fireworks in Wentzville

City ordinance allows fireworks to be discharged ONLY on July 3 and July 4, between the hours of noon and 11 p.m. each day. Outside the allowed time frame, a summons may be issued and fireworks may be confiscated. Please note, fireworks are not allowed to be set off on any property owned by the City, including any streets and cul-de-sacs or any park within the City at any time. 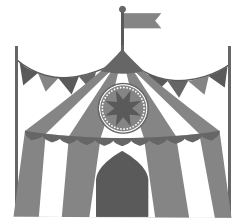

Flock Safety Cameras

The Wentzville Police Department (WPD) utilizes many types of technology to solve and prevent crime throughout our community. Since March 2021, Wentzville's partnership with Flock Safety, a company that provides an Automated License Plate Reader (ALPR) service, has provided officers with real-time data and alerts when a wanted or stolen vehicle passes by these cameras. These cameras are not used for traffic enforcement, they do not take photos of the vehicle occupants and are not equipped with facial recognition technology.

The Flock Safety cameras are just one more tool to assist WPD officers to help solve and prevent crime. This partnership will allow WPD to continue to deliver superior law enforcement service for our residents, businesses and visitors to uphold our mission statement. As technology and crime trends change, these ALPR cameras allow WPD to remain at the leading edge to continue to provide safety and security for the City of Wentzville.



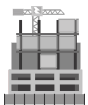
Extra Patrol and Vacation Checks
