## **Utility Tax Rebate Reminders**

Between now and May 31, Wentzville residents can apply for a City utility-tax refund. Application options include:

- Email required documents to City.Inquiry@wentzvillemo.gov
- Mail the required documents to: Utility-Tax Rebate, City of Wentzville, 1001 Schroeder Creek Blvd., Wentzville, MO 63385
- Set up an appointment to apply in person at City Hall by calling (636) 639-2155.

Eligibility requirements: You must rent or own your primary residence in the City of Wentzville; be at least 65 years old or considered totally disabled by Social Security; and have a 2022 maximum gross income of \$53,150 for a single-person household or \$60,750 for a married-couple household. Total gross income does include your social security.

Please bring: a photo ID or Social Security card, proof of income, proof of residency, proof of age and/or disability, and municipal tax reports or copies of 2022 gas and electric bills. Visit **www.wentzvillemo.gov/taxrebate** for additional details.

# Pay Your Bill 24/7/365

The City of Wentzville gives residents access to your utility account 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. Pay your bills on your own time — with no waiting. Access your account instantly through a secure, automated system to get real-time balances, payment amounts and due dates. For more information about bill payment, please contact the utility billing office at (636) 639-2155.

- To make your payment or access your account information over the phone, please call (833) 326-7020. Please note: additional fees may apply.
- As a resident, you can also pay your bill online by accessing the City's virtual payment portal. Bill payment is available on the City's website at www.wentzvillemo.gov/paymybill. All payment methods are secure, so you don't have to worry about entering your payment information online.
- Don't want to pay virtually or by phone? No problem! Wentzville City Hall has a convenient drive-up-and-drop-off Utility Payment Dropbox. You can drop off your utility bills at any time, without even having to get out of your car.

#### Resident Reminders Backflow Tests June 1

All lawn irrigation systems, fire sprinkler systems and commercial service lines within the City of Wentzville are required to contain a backflow prevention device. These devices must be tested annually by a state of Missouri-certified tester.

Annual backflow test reports are due to the City of Wentzville by June 1. Before June 1, early-bird filing fees are only \$10. #### **Excess Trash and Cardboard Tips**

Please remember, trash that does not fit in your cart must be bagged (this includes cardboard). Unbagged trash/cardboard cannot be collected. You can dispose of up to three extra 40-gallon bags of trash each week. After the third bag, however, you will be charged \$2.50 per bag. - Sign Up for Our eNewsletters: Stay informed about parks and recreation events and programs, economic development news and general City updates by signing up for one or more of the City's eNewsletters. - Sign Up for Wentzville's Emergency Alerts: The W.I.N.D. system (or Wentzville Information Notification Delivery) is used to notify residents and business owners about imminent threats to health and safety. City officials may send alerts about emergencies including critical issues, severe weather, water outages, traffic issues and police activity. If you sign up for City announcements, you will receive information on the topics you designate. Those who sign up can receive alerts by phone, by text and/or by email. To sign up, please visit www.wentzvillemo.gov/signupforWIND. If you've signed up previously, please log in to ensure your contact information is up-to-date.
- Update Your Email Address: We do our best to keep updated contact information for all Wentzville residents, but we need your help. Ensure that you receive all of Wentzville's important news and alerts by updating your email address and other account information.
