Restart Split Lawn and Landscaping Watering Schedules on June 1

As summer unfolds, our community often experiences hot and dry conditions, which leads to a high demand for lawn and landscaping watering. With the well-being of our community in mind, Wentzville residents and businesses are encouraged to adopt a split schedule for lawn and landscaping irrigation from June 1 to Sept. 30. **These measures are intended to support our collective efforts in maintaining a sustainable water supply.**


During split lawn and landscaping watering, a three-days-per-week schedule for regular lawn and landscaping irrigation is suggested:

- **Customers with even-numbered addresses** will schedule regular lawn and landscaping watering on Monday, Wednesday and Friday mornings.
- **Customers with odd-numbered addresses** will schedule regular lawn and landscaping watering on Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday mornings.
- **Supplemental watering is available** for customers on Sunday mornings at half of a regular scheduled watering day to ensure pressures remain balanced across the community.

The City encourages customers to schedule 50% of lawn and landscaping watering outside the peak morning hours of 5 a.m. to 8 a.m. Customers may find that watering before 5 a.m. or after 8 a.m. improves sprinkler operation, leading to better watering coverage.

During hot and dry summer weather, residents are encouraged to consider an additional deep watering once every other week by adding afternoon or evening watering cycles on a regular watering day. For more summer lawn tips, check out the website at www.wentzvillemo.gov/LawnManagement.

JULY 4TH PARADE

Make plans to celebrate Independence Day in Wentzville! The annual Fourth of July Parade starts at 10 a.m. on Thursday, July 4, at the Wentzville Ice Arena and travels south on Luetkenhaus Boulevard, turns right onto Pearce Boulevard, and ends near Pearce Boulevard and Allen Street. Everyone is invited to participate in the parade by designing a float. This year's theme is "America's Celebration." Floats will be judged for overall first, second and third place, along with Mayor's Choice and Best-Themed Entry for first and second place. Float registration is required. Email WentzvilleEvents@wentzvillemo.gov or call (636) 639-2085 to register. The float registration deadline is June 7, and a \$10 late fee will be applied to applications submitted after this date. PUBLIC SERVICE RECOGNITION WEEK

Celebrated the first week of May since 1985, Public Service Recognition Week honors those who serve our nation as federal, state, county and local government employees. Public servants do amazing things across our great nation, around the world, and in our hometown and community. So, take a moment this month to thank a public service employee for their dedication to a job well done! Please note that City Hall will be closed on Tuesday, May 9, from 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. for a Public Service Recognition employee event.

FIREWORKS REMINDERS

City ordinance allows fireworks to be discharged ONLY on July 3 and July 4 of each year, and only between the hours of noon and 11 p.m. each day. These restrictions will be strictly enforced. Outside this allowed time frame, a summons may be issued, and fireworks may be confiscated. Please take precautions when shooting off fireworks and be mindful and courteous of your neighbors.

Remember:

- A responsible adult should supervise all fireworks activities. Never give fireworks to children.
- Light one firework at a time and then move away.
- Always have a bucket of water and a hose nearby.
- Alcohol and fireworks do not mix. Save your alcohol for after the show.
- Dispose of spent fireworks by wetting them down and placing them in a metal trash can away from any buildings. Do not place fireworks in your plastic trash carts, as they can easily melt.

Please note that fireworks are not allowed to be set off on City property, including streets, sidewalks and cul-de-sacs, or at any park within the City. To report illegal fireworks use, please call the nonemergency line at (636) 327-5105. To learn more, visit www.wentzvillemo.gov/Fireworks.

Be a Good Neighbor

After the fireworks are complete, make sure to clean up your area and the area surrounding your residence. Let debris cool completely before putting it into your trash cart. You can allow it to cool in place or put it into a metal container to cool. If debris doesn't cool completely, trash carts can melt. HOLIDAY HOURS AND SOLID WASTE COLLECTION CHANGES

Memorial Day: City Hall will be closed for Memorial Day on Monday, May 27. Trash, recycling and yard-waste collection for the week of Memorial Day is as follows: Monday pickups will move to Tuesday, Tuesday pickups will move to Wednesday, and so forth, ending with Friday pickups taking place on Saturday, June 1.

Beginning on Thursday, trash, recycling and yard-waste collection will move forward one day. Thursday's collection will move to Friday, July 5, and Friday's collection will move to Saturday, July 6.



Backflow Tests Due June 1



All lawn irrigation systems, fire sprinkler systems and commercial service lines within the City of Wentzville are required to contain a backflow prevention device. These devices must be tested annually by a state of Missouri-certified tester. Annual backflow test reports are due to the City of Wentzville by June 1. Before June 1, early-bird filing fees are only \$10. Wentzville Business Grant Opportunities

Utility-Tax Rebate Ends on May 31

Between now and May 31, Wentzville residents can apply for a utility-tax rebate from the City. To be eligible, you must rent or own your primary residence in the City of Wentzville; be at least 65 years old or considered totally disabled by Social Security; and have a 2023 maximum gross income of \$56,250 for a single-person household or \$64,300 for a married-couple household. Splash Station Aquatic Center and Progress Park Pool will open Memorial Day weekend: May 25, 26 and 27. Beginning June 1, pools at Splash Station Aquatic Center and Progress Park Pool will be open daily through Aug. 16, except in cases of inclement weather or unforeseen circumstances. Progress Park Pool is open daily from noon-5 p.m., while Splash Station is open weekdays from noon-6 p.m. and weekends from noon-6:30 p.m. Please note: outdoor aquatic facilities are closed when Wentzville School District is in session.

Board Update: Citywide Infrastructure Projects

These utility-related infrastructure projects represent just a portion of the many Board-approved projects planned for 2024 and beyond.

As Wentzville continues to grow, the City is undertaking numerous infrastructure projects that may not always be visible but are vital to the community's future. These efforts are part of the City's Capital Improvement Program, carefully planned and often operating behind the scenes. When available, external funding sources, such as American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) dollars, are used to help ensure the City's continued fiscal responsibility.

Stormwater

In 2024, the City will use federal ARPA dollars to enhance the City's stormwater system, primarily in Historic Downtown Wentzville. These improvements, totaling approximately \$660,000 in outside funding, will increase safety for motorists, reduce the need for emergency maintenance and boost the overall functionality of the City's stormwater infrastructure.

Water

The construction of a new \$9,860,000 water storage tank, of which \$860,000 will be funded by ARPA dollars, will enhance the City's water supply during peak demand and provide additional storage for fire protection and mechanical failures. This will help maintain a reliable water supply for residential, commercial and industrial uses.

Wastewater

The City will undertake multiple waterline connection projects to replace and upsize deteriorated sections of the water main. These large-scale projects, which will be conducted using in-house teams and contractors, will total approximately \$7,100,000 and are designed to improve water pressure and fire flow capacity while reducing maintenance costs and minimizing water outages.

Over the next few years, multiple lift station replacement and repair projects — totaling approximately \$8,225,000, with \$5,640,000 from outside sources — will be carried out. These projects are crucial for improving safety, lifecycle costs and maintenance ease, and will enhance the flow capacity and reliability at each location. Additionally, several sanitary sewers near stream banks are at risk due to bank deterioration. Upcoming projects totaling approximately \$750,000 will address these issues, reducing exposure and increasing protection against overflow and infiltration.

Parks and Recreation Infrastructure Enhancements



The Wentzville Parks and Recreation Department also has several projects on the horizon between 2024 and 2028.

- Approximately \$350,000 in boardwalk improvements at Heartland Park will focus on redesigning and reconstructing the support beams and replacing the structural components of the boardwalk. This will address safety concerns and ensure the structural integrity of the boardwalk, while enhancing access to the lake and providing a gathering place for families.
- A floating fishing dock system will be added to the lake at Heartland Park. This new feature, which will total approximately \$84,000 with \$15,000 in outside funding, will not only allow anglers better access to the water but also support the health and growth of the fish population.
- The extension of the Heartland Park Trail: \$486,500 with \$215,000 in outside funding
- A new restroom and pavilion at Fireman's Park: \$453,000; and
- A fountain at Heartland Park to aid in water aeration and quality improvement: \$87,000, with \$15,000 in outside funding.

These upcoming enhancements, collectively aimed at improving community spaces and recreational facilities, demonstrate the Wentzville Parks and Recreation Department's commitment to fostering more engaging and sustainable environments for everyone to enjoy.
