Citywide Yard Sale

Whether you're looking for bargains or cleaning out your home, Wentzville's Citywide Yard Sale is for you! Join us for our Citywide Yard Sale on Friday and Saturday, Sept. 24 and 25. Rid your home of any unwanted items by listing your sale for just \$10. The deadline to register is Sunday, Sept. 19. To register your sale, please visit www.wentzvillemo.gov/yardsale.

Beginning Wednesday, Sept. 22, treasure hunters may purchase a booklet listing all the area sales for only \$5. Booklets are available at City Hall or Progress Park. Customers who purchase a booklet will also be emailed a link to the digital version.

Large-Item Pickup

Twice each year, the City offers FREE large-item pickup service for Wentzville residents. During the week of Sept. 27-Oct. 1, residential utility customers may place bulky items out for collection. This is a great opportunity to rid your home of unwanted furniture and old appliances! - Place items at the curb by 6 a.m. on your regular collection day:
- Abide by the FOUR-ITEM LIMIT per household. Houses that exceed this item limit will not have their items collected.

Please note: This large-item pickup is offered free for residential utility customers ONLY. Homes that do not receive Wentzville utility service will not have their large items collected.

Electronics Recycling and Personal Document Shredding

Do you have electronic waste — old phones, broken laptops, worn-out power tools? You can recycle them all at the City's FREE* Electronics Recycling and Personal Document Shredding event on Saturday, Oct. 30. Aside from keeping electronic waste out of our landfills, electronics recycling helps conserve our natural resources and save money. Help us keep our local landfills free of electronic waste and join us for this drive-thru-and-drop-off style event from 9-11:30 a.m. at Holt High School, located at 600 Campus Dr.

This event is open to individuals and families residing in the City of Wentzville; no businesses, please. Almost anything with a plug is accepted FREE for this electronics recycling event, but some items (such as TVs and items containing Freon) will incur a fee. Personal shredding is limited to six "Bankers Boxes" (or the same size) OR three 13-gallon (kitchen-sized) garbage bags, per vehicle. Please note: Participants should ONLY shred items with personally identifiable information. Items that DO NOT contain personally identifiable information should be recycled at a drop-off site or in your FIBER recycling cart.

Wentzville Rec Center Update

The new Wentzville Rec Center (WREC) is going vertical! Over the next several months, residents will begin to see this facility take shape at the Wentzville Bend. Located on Wentzville Parkway between West Meyer Road and Schroeder Creek Boulevard, the WREC is projected to open in the fall of 2022. This 100,000 square foot facility will bring a variety of new amenities to our community, including a multi-court gymnasium, elevated walking track, fitness center, multi-purpose rooms, senior activity space, indoor pool, kid zone, eSports center and more!

Facade Improvement Grant Applications Open

Wentzville's Façade Improvement Grant summer application period is now open! Visit **www.wentzvillemo.gov/facadegrant** to complete your application by Aug. 31, 2021.

The purpose of this program is to permit and encourage the preservation of historic structures and avoid general neighborhood deterioration through renovation and restoration. This program is open to businesses and mixed-use buildings more than 50 years old that are located in the HD-1, HD-2 or HD-3 zoning districts. Residential structures are not eligible. Facade Improvement Grants are a 50-50 match for an amount not to exceed \$10,000, per project. A total of \$50,000 has been set aside for 2021 grants.
