Yard-Waste Collection Resumes in March

There are a number of solid waste related changes happening in 2022. To learn more, please visit www.wentzvillemo.gov/2022solidwasteupdates.

Each year, yard-waste collection begins the first full week in March and continues through the last week of December. If not canceled, collection automatically resumes the week of March 1. Cancellations will be accepted until Feb. 28, and a 10-month service agreement is required.

For those with the service, yard waste must be set out by 6 a.m. on your regular solid-waste collection day, and you are allowed a 15-bag maximum per week. If you prefer to provide your own yard-waste cart, it must be clearly marked with "Yard-Waste Only" stickers on the lid and both sides of the cart, and must be pre-approved for use.

To schedule a per-bag, one-time yard-waste pickup (at least two days before your collection day), please call (636) 327-5101 or complete the online form at **www.wentzvillemo.gov/solidwasterequest**. Please note: there is a three-bag minimum with a per bag/bundle charge of \$4, and a minimum charge of \$12 per appointment.

Bundles must be tied with natural twine or other biodegradable binding material. Yard waste includes leaves, grass clippings, and limbs and branches that are not more than four feet long, three inches in diameter or more than 50 pounds each.

Changes Are Coming to Solid Waste Collection in 2022

There will be many changes to your Solid Waste Collection in early 2022. These changes are necessary in order to increase efficiencies and maintain high-quality service for our growing Wentzville community. We appreciate your patience as we roll out these changes!

FAQs can be found at www.wentzvillemo.gov/ 2022solidwasteupdates. Please note, the FAQs will be updated as we finalize additional details. While not all-inclusive, here are the top four things you need to know.

1. Single-Stream Recycling is Back

All recyclables can go in one cart again! Plus, everyone will receive curbside recycling collection at no extra cost. Recyclables include plastics #1-7, paper and cardboard (no glass).

2. Carts will be Furnished

Moving forward, personal carts cannot be used for recycling or trash collection.

3. Drop-Off Sites Will Be Closing

Now that curbside pickup is included for all customers, the drop-off sites will be eliminated.

4. Discounted Residential Dumpsters

Are you working on a remodeling project or cleaning out your basement? You can now schedule a residential dumpster through Meridian at a discounted rate.
