## **Bunny Run: 5k and Fun Run**

Join us for the annual Bunny Run on Saturday, March 27! Whether you want to take on the 5K, challenge yourself with a 10K or walk/run the One-Mile Fun Run, it's time to lace up your running shoes and race around Heartland Park!

All registered participants will receive a custom race shirt, access to on-course water stations, and post race drinks and snacks. Register by March 1 to guarantee shirt sizes. 5K and 10K participants will be professionally timed. Packet pickup and same-day registration starts at 5:30 a.m. on race day; the race starts at 7 a.m. The 10K course is a second lap of the 5K course.

Awards will be given to the top three overall male and female winners for the 5K and 10K. Age-group awards will be given to 5K and 10K male and female winners in each of the following age groups; 10 and under, 11-14, 15-19, 20-29, 30-39, 40-49, 50-59, 60-69, 70 and older. Overall winners will not receive awards for winning their age group.

Racers can pick up packets at Wentzville Ice Arena on March 25 from 9 a.m.-1 p.m. or March 26 from 4:30-8 p.m. Please note: Day-of registration will increase by \$5.

### **Get a Visit from the Easter Bunny**

Get a visit from the Easter Bunny! Wentzville residents can have the Easter Bunny stop by your home for a special hello while he tosses Easter eggs on your front lawn. Visits are available on Saturday, March 20 or Sunday, March 21. Participants must register by March 12. A \$15 fee is due at the time of registration and includes 25 candy-filled eggs. You may purchase an extra 25 eggs for an additional \$15.

This year, participants will have access to a new tracking system that allows you to watch the Easter Bunny as he travels around Wentzville and gets closer to your home! Please note: This program is for Wentzville residents only.

#### **Yard-Waste Collection Resumes in March**

Each year, yard-waste collection begins the first full week in March and continues through the last week of December. Collection will automatically resume the week of March 1 if service is not canceled. Cancellations will be accepted until March 30.

For those with service, yard waste must be set out by 6 a.m. on your regular solid-waste collection day. If you prefer to provide your own cart, it must be clearly marked with "Yard-Waste-Only" stickers on the lid and both sides of the cart. You can request these stickers by calling Public Works at (636) 327-5102.

To schedule a per-bag, one-time, yard-waste pickup, please call (636) 327-5102 or complete the online form at **www.wentzvillemo.gov/solidwasterequest**. This service must be scheduled a minimum of two business days before your regular solid-waste collection day.

Yard waste includes leaves, grass clippings, limbs and branches. Limbs and branches cannot be more than four feet long, three inches in diameter or weigh more than 40 pounds. Bundles should be tied with a natural twine or other biodegradable binding material. Yard waste does not include dirt, sod, rock, concrete, asphalt, lumber, tree stumps or limbs more than three inches in diameter. ## Pay Your Bill 24/7/365

The City of Wentzville gives residents access to your utility account 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. Pay your bills on your own time — with no waiting. Access your account instantly through a secure, automated system to get real-time balances, payment amounts and due dates. To make your payment or access your account information over the phone, please call (833) 326-7020. Please note: Additional fees may apply.

Residents can also pay their bills online by accessing the City's virtual payment portal. Bill payment is available on the City's website at **www.wentzvillemo.gov/paymybill**. All payment methods are secure, so residents don't have to worry about entering their payment information online.

Don't want to pay virtually or by phone? No problem. Wentzville City Hall has a convenient drive-up-and-drop-off Utility Payment Dropbox. Residents can drop off their utility bills at any time, without even having to get out of your car.
