Sign up for Swim Lessons

We are excited to welcome swimmers back for another summer of fun! Make sure your child is ready to jump in this summer by signing them up for swim lessons. Wentzville Parks and Recreation offers group, private and semi-private swim lessons at a variety of skill levels.

Whether your child is ready for the deep end or just starting out, we have a swim lesson that's perfect for their skill level. See below to learn more about our various swim lessons.

Stingray (Level 1)

This beginner-level class will help your child master the front and back kick with instructor support, feet-first jumping, head submersion, entering and exiting pool without assistance and the back float with instructor support.

Marlin (Level 2)

This level is designed for those who are comfortable in the water and are ready to learn more independent swimming. Skills to be mastered include submersion of the head and face, front and back kick without support, and basic front and back crawl.

Walrus (Level 3)

This level will further develop your child's swim strokes and help them start to build some basic technique and endurance. Skills to be mastered include submersion of the head and face without hesitation, front crawl with rhythmic breathing and basic front and back crawl. This class will spend time in water 12-13 feet deep.

Dolphin (Level 4)

This level will help your child perfect their front stroke, backstroke and elementary backstroke. Skills to be mastered include treading water for 60 seconds and basic performance of breaststroke and sidestroke. This class spends time in water 12-13 feet deep.

Shark (Level 5)

As our highest level of instruction, these lessons focus almost entirely on technique and preparation for swim team or fitness swimming. Swimmers at this level have learned and practiced all strokes, but need further assistance in perfecting them and swimming more efficiently. Skills to be mastered include advancement of basic swim strokes, treading water for two minutes without using hands, flip turns, basic butterfly stroke, starts and entries.

Backflow Tests Due June 1

All lawn irrigation systems, fire sprinkler systems and commercial service lines within the City of Wentzville are required to contain a backflow prevention device. These devices must be tested annually by a state of Missouri-certified tester.

Annual backflow test reports are due to the City of Wentzville by June 1. Before June 1, early-bird filing fees are only \$5.
