Candidate Filing Opens Dec. 10

Starting at 8 a.m. on Tuesday, Dec. 10, candidates may begin filing for the elected municipal offices that will appear on the April 2025 ballot. Candidates must file in person at City Hall, located at 1001 Schroeder Creek Blvd. The filing period will remain open until 5 p.m. on Tuesday, Dec. 31. Positions open for filing include one Alderman from each of the three Wards and Municipal Judge. There is a \$25 fee, due when filing.

- City ordinances state that candidates running for Alderman must be at least 18 years of age, a U.S. citizen, and an inhabitant and resident of the City for at least one year prior to the election. Candidates running for Alderman must also be a resident — at the time they file and during the time they serve — of the Ward from which they are elected.
- Candidates for Municipal Judge shall be a licensed attorney, qualified to practice law within the state of Missouri, and a resident of St. Charles County at the time of his/her election. The Municipal Judge need not reside within the city limits of Wentzville. The Municipal Judge shall be between 21 and 75 years of age.
