Pay Your Bill Your Way!

Did you know that Wentzville utility customers can view balances and make payments on their utility bills 24/7, 365 days a year? With the City's many billing options, Wentzville utility customers have access to quick, easy and contactless payments anywhere at any time.

- Autopay: Forget the stress of bill payment when you sign up for quick, contactless autopay. Sign up at www.wentzvillemo.gov/utilityautopay or by scanning the QR code on the back of your utility bill.
- **Text-2-Pay:** The City of Wentzville now offers Text-2-Pay! Just call (833) 326-7020 and select option 4 to set up text-2-pay for your account.
- **24/7/365 Payments:** Access your account instantly through our secure, automated system to get real-time balances, payment amounts and due dates by calling (833) 326-7020.

Solid Waste Collection Reminders

The City of Wentzville and its contracted hauler work hard to service all Wentzville residents in a timely and efficient manner. In order for collection crews to stay on schedule, Wentzville utility customers are asked to follow these guidelines when placing their solid waste out for collection.

- Place carts at the curb no later than 6 a.m. on your collection day. Carts placed out after 6 a.m. may not be collected.
- Place all solid-waste items inside your cart. Items left beside the cart could be missed or carried away by the wind. This creates debris and unwanted litter on our City's streets. Any items that do not fit in your cart should be properly bagged and placed at the curb.
- Do not place bulky items or excessive trash at the curb unless you have scheduled a special large pickup. Collection crews are on a tight schedule. Stopping to collect unbagged or bulky trash slows them down and can cause delays in the collection process.
- **Do not leave your carts at the curb for more than 48 hours.** City municipal code allows for solid-waste carts to be stored outdoors on your residential property, but not at the curb.

Halloween Safety Reminders

The City of Wentzville wishes everyone a very happy Halloween! When your child leaves home to collect goodies on the spookiest night of the year, be sure to make Halloween safety a priority. To ensure your child has a fun-filled evening of trick-ortreating, here are a few tips from the Wentzville Police Department to be "safe and seen" on Halloween.

- Carry glow sticks or flashlights, and use reflective tape or stickers on costumes and bags to help kids be seen by drivers.
- Children under age 12 should be accompanied by an adult at all times.
- Slow down and be alert while driving! Turn on your headlights early in the evening so you can spot kids from further away.
- Remind kids to cross the street at corners or in crosswalks and to never step in front of oncoming traffic.
- Choose face paint over costume masks; masks can limit a child's vision.

WPD Crime Mapping

The Wentzville Police Department works hard to keep our community safe. Part of that effort is Crime Mapping. Crime Mapping is the process of logging crimes by location and type to track the frequency of certain crimes in certain areas. In conjunction with St. Charles County Regional Law Enforcement Agencies, the Wentzville Missouri Police Department actively provides data to the St. Charles County Regional Crime Map. This map allows residents to check for offenses reported within the county and/or participating cities. New data is uploaded weekly. Users can view offenses within the last 14 or 30 days, or year to date. Reports can be filtered by type of offense or by agency/city. Electronics Recycling + Document Shredding

Do you have electronic waste — old phones, broken laptops, worn-out power tools? You can recycle them all during the City's next Electronics Recycling and Personal Document Shredding event. This is FREE* drive-thru and drop-off event is open to families and individuals (no businesses, please). *Almost anything with a plug is accepted. However, some items (such as TVs and items with Freon) will incur a fee. Learn more at www.wentzvillemo.gov/acceptedelectronics.

Personal shredding is limited to six "Bankers Boxes" (or the same size) OR three 13-gallon (kitchen-sized) garbage bags, per vehicle. NOTE: Please only shred items with personally identifiable information. Items that DO NOT contain personally identifiable information should be recycled at a drop-off site or in your FIBER recycling cart.
