Fall Large-Item Pickup

Twice each year, the City offers FREE large-item pickup service for Wentzville residents. During the week of Sept. 27-Oct. 1, residential utility customers may place bulky items out for collection. This is a great opportunity to rid your home of unwanted furniture and old appliances! To view a list of accepted (and not accepted) bulky items or to find more information, please visit www.wentzvillemo.gov/largeitempickup. Here are some important reminders for Wentzville's Fall Large-Item Collection.

Large-Item Pickup DOs:

- Place items at the curb by 6 a.m. on your regular collection day.
- Follow the FOUR-ITEM LIMIT per household, per free pickup.
- Confirm that you are a Wentzville utility customer prior to placing items at the curb. This pickup is for residential trash customers ONLY.

Large-Item Pickup DON'Ts:

- Don't place more than FOUR ITEMS out for collection. Houses that exceed this limit will not have their bulky items collected.
- Don't leave bagged trash at the curb.
 This collection is for furniture,
 appliances and other bulky
 household items ONLY.

Have more than four items? Don't want to wait for the next free large-item pickup? Residential utility customers can schedule a large-item pickup at any time! These large-item pickups will incur a fee and must be scheduled a minimum of two business days in advance of your regular solid-waste collection day. Recently, insulated paneling was installed on some of the WREC's exterior walls, concrete was poured for the indoor lap pool and steel beams are currently being installed to frame the new eSports and creative studio space.

When completed, this 100,000 square foot facility will bring a variety of new amenities to our community, including a multi-court gymnasium, elevated walking track, fitness center, multi-purpose rooms, senior activity space, indoor pool, kid zone and more!

Fall Tree Limb Collection

Twice each year, the City's Chipper Program provides residents a free, convenient way to dispose of small tree limbs. The fall tree-limb pickup will take place over a three-week period — by ward. If you are unsure about which ward you live in, please visit www.wentzvillemo.gov/wardmap.

The fall 2021 schedule is as follows:

- Ward 1: Week of Oct. 4
- Ward 2: Week of Oct. 11
- Ward 3: Week of Oct. 18

Tree limbs must be less than eight inches in diameter and should not be bundled or placed in bags. The Chipper Program collection does not include leaves, root balls, shrubs or hedge trimmings, decorative grasses or grass.
