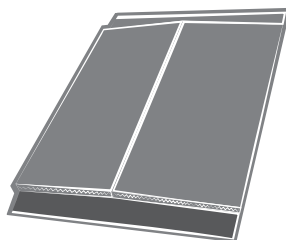
Pay Your Bill 24/7/365

Did you know you can access your utility account 24 hours a day, 365 days a year? Pay your bills on your own time — with no waiting. Access your account instantly through a secure, automated system to get real-time balances, payment amounts and due dates. For more information about bill payment, please contact the Utility Billing Office at (636) 639-2155.

- To make your payment or access your account information over the phone, please call (833) 326-7020. Please note: additional fees may apply.
- As a resident, you can also pay your bill online by accessing the City's virtual payment portal. Bill payment is available on the City's website at www.wentzvillemo.gov/PayMyBill. All payment methods are secure, so you don't have to worry about entering your payment information online.
- Don't want to pay virtually or by phone? No problem! Wentzville City Hall has a convenient drive-up-and-drop-off Utility Payment Dropbox. You can drop off your utility bills at any time without even having to get out of your car.

Excess Trash and Cardboard Tips

Please remember: trash that does not fit in your cart must be bagged (this includes cardboard). Unbagged trash/cardboard cannot be collected. Trash lids must be closed in order for your trash to be collected. You can dispose of up to three extra 40-gallon bags of trash each week. Understanding Your Property Tax Rate: The City's Role

One common question the City receives concerns property taxes and how they are determined. The City of Wentzville plays a role in setting its portion of the property tax rate. However, it's important to note that the overall property tax collected is largely influenced by other entities and St. Charles County, as the County is responsible for assessing property values. Here's an overview of how it works:

- **Property Value Assessment:** St. Charles County assesses the value of all properties in the county. This value is based on market conditions, property features and other factors. The County Assessor determines the assessed value that serves as the foundation for calculating property taxes. This real estate assessment takes place every other year as required by Missouri law.
- **Setting the City's Tax Rate:** Each year, the City of Wentzville sets its property tax rate within limits established by Missouri law. This rate funds City services like public safety, parks and infrastructure. It is based on the City's budget needs and approved by the Board of Aldermen.
- **Combining Taxing Jurisdictions:** The property tax bill you receive includes rates from multiple entities, such as the school district, county, fire and library districts, and others. The City's rate is only one portion of the total.
- **Why Your Taxes May Increase:** If your property's assessed value increases, your overall tax bill may go up, even if the City's rate remains the same or decreases. This is because other taxing entities or changes in assessed value affect the total amount due.

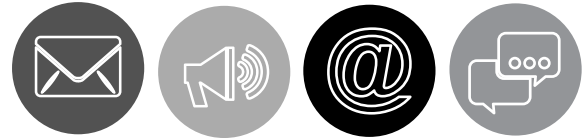

- **Sign Up for Wentzville's Emergency Alerts:** The WIND system (or Wentzville Information Notification Delivery) is used to notify residents and business owners about imminent threats to health and safety. City officials may send alerts about emergencies, including critical issues, severe weather, water outages, traffic issues and police activity. If you sign up for City announcements, you will receive information on the topics you designate. Those who sign up can receive alerts by phone, by text and/or by email. To sign up, please visit www.wentzvillemo.gov/SignUpForWIND. If you've signed up previously, please log in to ensure your contact information is up-to-date.
- **Update Your Email Address:** We do our best to keep updated contact information for all Wentzville residents, but we need your help. Ensure that you receive all of Wentzville's important news and alerts by updating your email address and other account information. 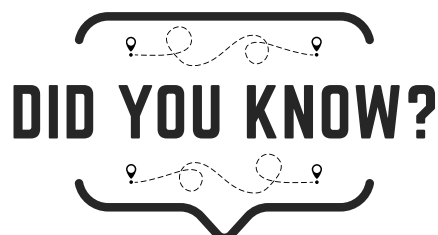
WPD Community Event Requests
