Solid Waste Service Requests

Wentzville residents can make changes to their solid-waste services, report a missed collection or schedule a free quarterly large-item pickup directly from a computer or mobile device.

Residents are asked to complete a short online form, which can be found at www.wentzvillemo.gov/SolidWaste. This form is for all missed pickup and service requests for solid waste, yard waste and recycling. This service is only for Wentzville solid-waste customers. Traffic Safety Campaign

The Wentzville Police Department has launched a Traffic Safety Campaign to help reduce crashes and improve roadway safety in our community. This initiative is active through the end of September.

Officers will focus on:

- Speed enforcement
- Hazardous driving (aggressive or distracted)
- Expired registrations
- Misuse of temporary tags

This data- and complaint-driven effort targets areas of concern based on crash stats and resident feedback. With a mix of enforcement and public education, the goal is simple: keep you and your loved ones safe on the road.

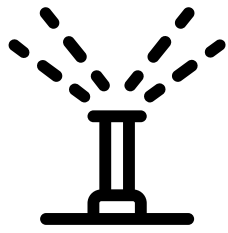

Split Lawn and Landscaping Watering Schedule

As summer brings hot and dry conditions, the demand for lawn and landscaping watering in our community increases. To ensure a sustainable water supply, Wentzville residents and businesses are encouraged to follow a split watering schedule from June 1 to Sept. 30.



The suggested three-day-per-week schedule is as follows:

- Even-numbered addresses: Monday, Wednesday and Friday mornings.
- Odd-numbered addresses: Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday mornings.

Supplemental watering is available on Sunday mornings at half the usual amount to maintain balanced water pressure. For better sprinkler performance, it is recommended to do 50% of watering outside peak hours (5 a.m. to 8 a.m.) Consider adding a deep watering session every other week during hot, dry weather, ideally in the afternoon or evening on a regular watering day. Fireworks in Wentzville

City ordinance allows fireworks to be discharged ONLY on July 3 and July 4, between noon and 11 p.m. on each day. Outside the allowed time frame, a summons may be issued, and fireworks may be confiscated. Please note that fireworks are not allowed to be set off on any property owned by the City, including any streets and cul-de-sacs or any park within the City at any time.



Please take precautions when shooting off fireworks and be mindful and courteous of your neighbors. To report illegal fireworks use, please call the Police Department at (636) 327-5105. To read the ordinance in its entirety, including the types of fireworks permitted to be discharged only on July 3 and July 4, please visit www.wentzvillemo.gov/Fireworks.



The 4th of July in Wentzville

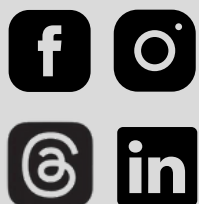
Make plans to celebrate Independence Day in Wentzville! The annual Fourth of July Parade starts at 10 a.m. at the Wentzville Ice Arena and travels south on Luetkenhaus Boulevard, turns right onto Pearce Boulevard and ends near Pearce Boulevard and Allen Street.



Everyone is invited to participate in the parade by designing a float. This year's theme is, "All American Summer." Floats will be judged for overall first, second and third place, along with Mayor's Choice and Best-Themed Entry for first and second place. Float registration is required. To register, visit www.wentzvillemo.gov/FourthOfJuly. The float registration deadline is June 6, and a \$10 late fee will be applied to applications submitted after this date. This event is FREE to observe.
