Make Your Utility Tax Rebate Appointment Online



From April 1 through May 31, eligible residents can apply for a City utility-tax refund. Eligible residents should use one of these methods to apply for the rebate:

- **Email:** Send the required documentation to ContactUs@wentzvillemo.gov or submit an online application (beginning April 1).
- **Mail:** Send the required documentation to:
 - Utility Tax Rebate, City of Wentzville, 1001 Schroeder Creek Blvd., Wentzville, MO 63385
- **In-Person:** Schedule an appointment to apply at City Hall by calling (636) 639-2121 or making an appointment online.
- **Online:** Starting April 1, you can apply online at www.wentzvillemo.gov/TaxRebate.

Solid Waste Update: New Cart Delivery Starts March 16


Starting this month, Wentzville residents will receive new solid waste carts to replace their existing trash, recycling and/or yard-waste carts as part of the updates happening this spring.

- Deliveries will begin the week of March 16 and continue through April.
- Your old carts will be collected on your regular pickup day, the week after your new carts arrive.
- New cart delivery will include instructions on when to set out your current carts for removal.

As a reminder, while Meridian currently provides collection services, it will assume full solid waste operations, including billing and customer service, beginning May 1. Utility Payment Box

Starting in May, the City Hall drive-up dropbox will exclusively accept City water and sewer bill payments. All solid waste billing will be handled by Meridian. Property Maintenance Inspections start April 1

Spring is here, and it's time to focus on our City's property maintenance standards. Please remember to keep your lawn height less than eight inches, maintain attractive curb appeal, clean out your gutters and generally help maintain the healthy, safe and stable community we all desire. Few things have more potential to enhance the quality of life for everyone in our community than neighborhood pride.

The City works with property owners and neighborhoods to address nuisance properties and housing violations, helping protect property values and make your neighborhood more pleasant and welcoming for residents and visitors alike. Maintaining your property helps ensure that your family lives in a clean, safe environment and contributes to neighborhood revitalization. For most people, their homes are their single largest investment.

The City conducts annual property maintenance inspections. Between April and September, all structures in the City of Wentzville will be inspected, with inspections beginning April 1. If City inspectors find a property that needs attention, a notice will be mailed to the property owner. This notice allows a reasonable amount of time for completion of the repair.

If you have a specific concern about a Wentzville property, you can submit it at www.wentzvillemo.gov/ConcernCenter or by calling the City at (636) 639-2121. Inspectors will verify the concern within 72 hours and respond back upon your request. Concerns may be filed anonymously as well. By remaining attentive to ensure all Wentzville properties are properly maintained, we can all work together to continue making Wentzville a desirable place to live and work.
