Make Your Utility Tax Rebate Appointment Online

From April 1 through May 31, eligible residents can apply for a City utility-tax refund. Eligible residents should use one of these methods to apply for the rebate:

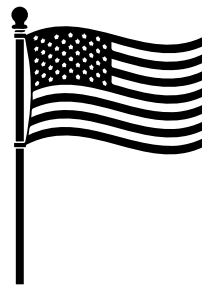
- **Email:** Send the required documentation to ContactUs@wentzvillemo.gov or submit an online application (beginning April 1).
- **Mail:** Send the required documentation to:

- **In-Person:** Schedule an appointment to apply at City Hall by calling (636) 639-2121 or making an appointment online.
- **Online:** Starting April 1, you can apply online at www.wentzvillemo.gov/TaxRebate.

Back Flow Testing

All lawn irrigation systems, fire sprinkler systems and commercial service lines within the City of Wentzville are required to contain a backflow prevention device. These devices must be tested annually by a state of Missouri-certified tester before June 1.

Know Before You Ride

As more people take advantage of warmer weather, we're seeing more bicycles, scooters, e-bikes and other motorized devices on our streets, sidewalks and trails. To keep everyone safe, the City of Wentzville has updated its riding regulations to reflect the way people are getting around today.

These updates create clearer guidelines for where different devices can be used, especially as newer, faster options become more common. The goal is simple: reduce confusion, prevent accidents and make sure everyone (including riders, drivers and pedestrians) can safely share our public spaces.

Before you head out, take a quick look at the chart and guidelines. If you have teens or new riders at home, this is a great time to review it together. A quick check now can help prevent confusion later and ensure everyone can enjoy Wentzville's streets, sidewalks and trails safely. Stay on top of your water usage with the EyeOnWater app! Residents serviced by the City of Wentzville Water Division can now monitor their consumption in real-time.

The EyeOnWater app provides:

- Real-Time Monitoring: View your usage in 15-minute, hourly, daily, monthly or annual intervals.
- Leak Alerts: Set up custom notifications to identify potential leaks early and avoid high bills.
- Easy Access: Use the secure website portal or download the smartphone app to manage your data from any device.

Cops and Bobbers

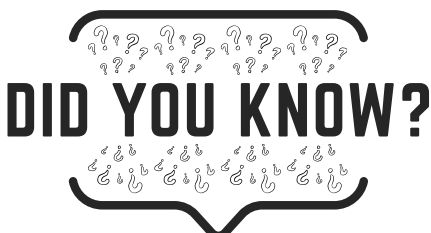
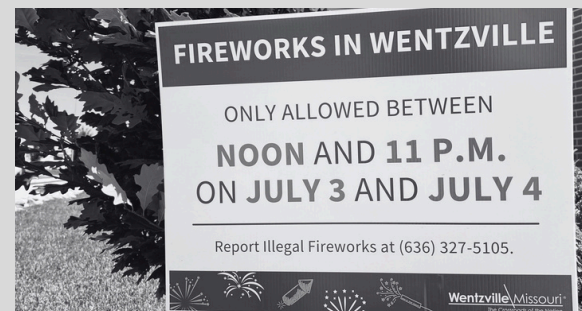
Cops and Bobbers is May 20 from 5-7 p.m. at Rotary Park!

Fireworks Reminders

City ordinance allows fireworks to be discharged ONLY on July 3 and July 4 of each year, and only between the hours of noon and 11 p.m. each day. These restrictions will be strictly enforced. Please take precautions when shooting off fireworks and be mindful and courteous of your neighbors. Please note that fireworks are not allowed to be set off on City property, including streets, sidewalks and cul-de-sacs, or at any park within the City.
