Fourth of July Celebration

This year's Fourth of July Celebration will include a parade, exclusive free swim at Progress Park Pool and free fireworks visible from Rotary Park. We invite Wentzville to come celebrate our nation's independence with us!

The annual Fourth of July Parade starts at 10 a.m. on July 4 at the Wentzville Ice Arena and travels south on Luetkenhaus Boulevard, turns right onto Pearce Boulevard and ends near Pearce Boulevard and Allen Street.

Progress Park Pool free swim is available for Outdoor Aquatic Season Passholders and Wentzville residents from noon-5 p.m. An Outdoor Aquatic Season Pass or a Resident Card is required to attend and must be presented upon entry to Progress Park Pool. Resident Cards cannot be obtained the day of the event.

Everyone is invited to bring a chair and watch the fireworks light up the sky at the new location! This year, the fireworks show will be at Rotary Park! Fireworks will start at 9:30 p.m.

Know Before You Ride

As more people take advantage of warmer weather, we're seeing more bicycles, scooters, e-Bikes and other motorized devices on our streets, sidewalks and trails. To keep everyone safe, the City of Wentzville has updated its riding regulations to reflect the way people are getting around today.

These updates create clearer guidelines for where different devices can be used, especially as newer, faster options become more common. The goal is simple: reduce confusion, prevent accidents and make sure everyone (including riders, drivers and pedestrians) can safely share our public spaces.

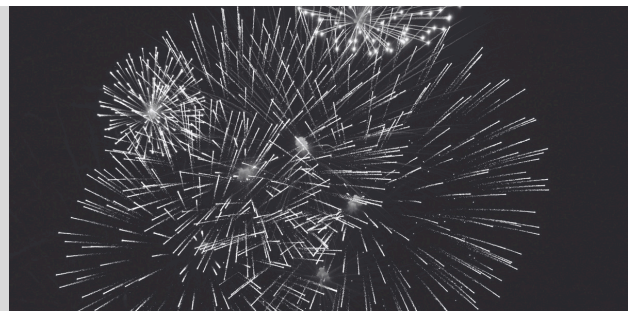


Wentzville Police Department Community Programs

Fireworks Reminders

City ordinance allows fireworks to be discharged ONLY on July 3 and July 4 of each year, and only between the hours of noon and 11 p.m. each day. These restrictions will be strictly enforced. Please take precautions when shooting off fireworks and be mindful and courteous of your neighbors. Please note that fireworks are not allowed to be set off on City property, including streets, sidewalks and cul-de-sacs, or at any park within the City.
